CEDD12	Talk on "Management of Public Fill and Marine Disposal of Dredged Sediment in Hong Kong"	Organising Department: Civil Engineering and Development Department Management of Public Fill The construction industry in Hong Kong generates a large amount of inert construction and demolition materials, which are also known as public fill, each year. These materials are mainly reused as fill materials in reclamation and earth filling works. Apart from some immediate reuse, surplus fill are delivered to and stockpiled at fill banks for subsequent reuse. To maintain the sustainability of our construction industry, surplus public fill must be timely and properly handled. Management of Marine Disposal of Dredged Sediment Although non-dredge methods are encouraged for Hong Kong reclamation projects, dredging is necessary for certain works related to the maintenance of harbours, fairways, anchorage or drainage channels. To comply with the environmental requirements, a framework has been established in Hong Kong for the management of dredged/excavated sediment disposal depending on the level of contamination of the sediment. Sediment disposal methods currently used in Hong Kong include the open sea disposal and the confined disposal at East Sha Chau. CEDD staff will introduce the management of public fill and marine disposal of dredged sediment in Hong Kong, and the operation of the fill banks and sediment disposal facilities to students at the schools. The topics cover introduction to correctional services and common juvenile crimes, discussion of micro movies, showing of videos on prison life and face-to-face sharing sessions with rehabilitated persons. CSD10	Rehabilitation Pioneer Project - Rehabilitation Pioneer Leaders	<p>Organising Department: Correctional Services Department Rehabilitation Pioneer Leaders (RPLs) is a youth uniformed group established under CSD in July 2018, which will carry the impact of RPP even further by recruiting and nurturing teenagers with great potential of leadership. Through diversified training, the group will broaden their horizons, develop their potential, foster their discipline, enhance their social responsibility and encourage them to actively contribute to the society in the future by helping promote law-abiding and inclusive values for a better Hong Kong. Over 100 students in three cohorts had been recruited since 2018. Two new regions, namely, the “Hong Kong Island Region” and the “Kowloon and New Territories Region” were established in 2019. Two training bases were set up in Hong Kong Correctional Services Academy and Ma Hang Prison and Phoenix House respectively to cohere with the two regions.
