These materials are mainly reused as fill materials in reclamation and earth filling works. Apart from some immediate reuse, surplus fill are delivered to and stockpiled at fill banks for subsequent reuse. To maintain the sustainability of our construction industry, surplus public fill must be timely and properly handled. Management of Marine Disposal of Dredged Sediment Although non-dredge methods are encouraged for Hong Kong reclamation projects, dredging is necessary for certain works related to the maintenance of harbours, fairways, anchorage or drainage channels. To comply with the environmental requirements, a framework has been established in Hong Kong for the management of dredged/excavated sediment disposal depending on the level of contamination of the sediment. Schools or organisations interested in the Scheme are welcomed to visit the appropriate correctional institutions according to the gender of participants. At present, male correctional institutions available for visit include ai Chi Rehabilitation Centre, Sha Tsui Correctional Institution, Tai Lam Correctional Institution, Pik Uk Prison, Tung Tau Correctional Institution, Pak Sha Wan Correctional Institution, Tong Fuk Correctional Institution, Cape Collinson Correctional Institution, Tai Tam Gap Correctional Institution. Female correctional institutions available for visit include Lo Wu Correctional Institution and Lai King Correctional Institution.</p> <p>Under the Scheme, facilities in correctional institutions such as persons in custody (PICs) dormitories, dining halls and workplaces are introduced to participants. Besides, participants are arranged to meet with PICs. By listening to their experience, participants are inspired to ponder on the serious consequences of committing crimes, thereby achieving the purpose of one life influencing another. The number of participants for each visit ranges from 20 to 25, including 2 to 5 teachers or social workers. 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| CSD07 | Rehabilitation Pioneer Project - Drama and Music Performance of "Creation and Rehabilitation" | <p>Organized By Correctional Services Department</p> <p>The "Creation and Rehabilitation" Programme is held in Stanley Prison every year. Hundreds of students will have an opportunity to enter the maximum security institution to enjoy the drama and music performance presented by persons in custody (PICs). The programme aims to integrate art therapy into rehabilitation process and helps PICs reflect on the meaning of life through arts activities. Through the drama, PICs will convey to the audience how rehabilitated persons strive to turn over a new leaf and reintegrate into society. Besides, inspirational songs are sung by a band composed of PICs to show their talents, and a PIC who is sentenced to a life sentence for having committed irreparable mistake will be arranged to share his experiences with students. Through the simulation of the real situation in prison, students are able to experience the life of persons in custody (PICs) in correctional institutions and reflect on the detrimental effects of committing crimes. The project covers a wide range of activities such as mock court hearing, simulated reception procedures, custody in dormitories and single cells, foot drill training, simulated work groups and sharing session by PICs, etc.</p> <p>To disseminate the messages of the project to students who have not participated in the project, a short video containing the highlights will be produced, and a sharing session will be arranged at the participating school or organisation after the project. The sharing session will be conducted in an interactive approach.
